SUBJECT SYLLABUSES

Attention is called to the fact that the ability of candidates to express themselves clearly and to present their answers neatly and accurately is taken into account in the assessment of their work in all subjects.

No special editions of set books are prescribed except those which are mentioned specifically; the Syndicate cannot undertake to recommend text-books.

The 3-figure numbers printed under the subject headings are the subject numbers which appear on the entry documents.

ENGLISH LANGUAGE

Ordinary Level. (O) 116 [May not be taken with Subject 117 (English

Language).]

Three compulsory papers (Papers 116/1-3) will be set as follows:

116/1 (1 hr.)

 $116/2 \ (1\frac{1}{2} \text{ hrs.})$

116/3 (1 hr.)

Papers 116/1 and 116/3 will both contain a choice of alternative subjects for continuous composition. In both papers candidates will write one composition.

Paper 116/2 will consist of a passage or passages of prose upon which questions will be set to test the candidates' ability to understand the content and argument of the given text, and to infer information and meanings from it. Questions to test the ability to summarize may be included.
