

Uptake of international GCSE subjects 2014

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Introduction

This report looks at the uptake of international GCSE¹ subjects in England in 2014, as a followup to our previous report for 2012 (Sutch, 2013). The data for these analyses were taken from the National Pupil Database (NPD). This is a database held by the Department for Education, consisting of results for all students in all subjects in schools and colleges in England, as well as pupil and school background characteristics such as age, gender, ethnicity and level of deprivation.

For the analysis of uptake at international GCSE the Key Stage 4 (KS4) extract of the NPD was used, consisting of all students who were at the end of KS4 in 2014 (i.e. in Year 11). Uptake in this report is defined as the percentage of these students taking an international GCSE in the subject, and includes exams taken by these students in previous years.

International GCSEs are offered in England by AQA, Edexcel, Cambridge International Examinations and WJEC. Some international GCSE syllabuses have been approved for teaching in state schools; these are more formally known as Level 1/Level 2 Certificates (and are identified as such in the NPD) and are regulated by Ofqual. In this report, only regulated international GCSEs are presented, as data on unregulated international GCSEs is no longer available from the National Pupil Database.

Table 1 presents a breakdown of the number of international GCSEs taken by students, split by gender.

Uptake of international GCSEs in this report is presented by different student classifications: gender, school type, deprivation level, prior attainment and school gender. In the following tables the numbers of students in each of the classifications are presented. Note that the totals in these tables are in some cases less than the total number of students; this is due to differences in data availability.

School type

There are several different types of school where students study at KS4. For this report these were classified into five groups. Table 2 presents the number of KS4 students attending each school type, and the percentage in each group taking international GCSEs.

Pupil attainment

Students were classified by their attainment at KS4, using combined results from GCSEs and regulated international GCSEs. Grades were converted into scores ($A^* = 8$, A= 7, B= 6 etc) and a mean score was calculated for each student, which was then used to divide students up into three approximately equally sized attainment groups: low, medium and high. Table 3 presents the number in each group as well as the mean, minimum and maximum value of the mean score for each group.

Deprivation level

The level of deprivation a student experiences was measured by the Income Deprivation Affecting Children Index (IDACI). This is a measure of the proportion of children in a very small geographical area (Lower Layer Super Output Area or LSOA) who live in families that are income deprived. It varies between 0 and 1, with 0 representing minimum deprivation and 1 maximum deprivation.

It should be noted that there was some missing data for this measure (almost 9% of students had no record). Students who did have a measure of deprivation were divided up into three equally sized groups. Table 4 presents the number of students and the mean, minimum and maximum IDACI values in each group.

School gender

The school gender variable was determined by the female ratio (number of females over the total number of students) in the school. If this ratio was greater than 0.95, the school was considered to be a "Girls" school. If the female ratio was less than 0.05, then the school was designated a "Boys" school. The rest of the schools were considered "Mixed" schools. Table 5 shows the numbers of students attending the different types of schools.

Number of regulated international GCSEs taken

The number of international GCSEs taken by students in each of the classifications is presented in Tables 6 to 9. For example, Table 7 shows that 13.4% of students with low attainment took two regulated international GCSEs, compared with 5.3% of students with high attainment.
