

Building a Better History Curriculum (11-19)

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Speaker biographies:

Chris Skidmore MP was born in Bristol in 1981. He was educated at Bristol Grammar School and Christ Church, Oxford, where he was a St Cyre's and Dixon Scholar and President of the Oxford University Historical Society. He graduated in 2002 with a double first and was awarded a Gibbs Prize. Chris conducted postgraduate research at Oxford, where he was a convenor of a graduate seminar on the Tudor nobility. He was an adviser and researcher to Bristol's bid for European Capital City of Culture 2008 and was research assistant to Robert Lacey for his Great Tales of English History series. Chris has also written for the Western Daily Press and People Magazine. Chris currently teaches Early Modern History part-time at Bristol University. Chris' first book, *Edward VI: The Lost King of England* was published in 2007. His latest book, *Death and The Virgin*, an investigation into the mysterious death of Amy Robsart, was published in February 2010.

Dr Seán Lang is Senior Lecturer in History, Anglia Ruskin University. He is an experienced textbook writer and history teacher and was Head of History at Hills Road Sixth Form College, Cambridge 1992-2001. He is a Fellow and former Honorary Secretary of the Historical Association.

Martin Roberts sits on the Academic Steering Committee of the Prince's Training Institute. He was Headteacher of the Cherwell School, Oxford 1981-2002 and currently sits on the Governing Bodies of two secondary schools. He has written many history textbooks for schools. He sat on the Council of EUROCLIO and is a Fellow and former Deputy President of the Historical Association.

Nicolas Kinloch is Professional Tutor at the Netherhall School, Cambridge, where he was Head of History 1985-2005. He has written textbooks for school and was editor both of HINDSIGHT GCSE history magazine 1990-2005 and of Teaching History. He is a former Deputy President of the Historical Association.
