TRAVEL GEOGRAPHY

Any college interested in this subject should inform the Board as soon as possible. For the 1973 examination the Board will **not** set a question paper; colleges being required to set their own paper and to mark the scripts internally. The question paper and the marking will, however, be assessed by the Board.

I. AIM

To introduce students to the aspects of geography which closely influence the nature and patterns of travel and the establishment and development of major holiday areas in Britain and abroad.

2. SYLLABUS

NOTE: Candidates will be expected to:

- (a) be able to produce and interpret simple sketch maps and statistical maps and diagrams;
- (b) be able to locate the major land masses, oceans, continents, major mountain areas and rivers and recognise and describe features associated with the major land forms;
- (c) have studied the distribution of world population and its relevance to the major tourist areas, world climatic patterns and their effect on tourism.

Candidates will be expected to refer to these items when answering questions on specific regional studies.

2.1 CURRENT MAJOR TOURIST AREAS

A study of selected areas from the points of view of:

- (a) reasons for development of tourism (communications, climate);
- (b) cultural, economic and social patterns of the people;
- (c) food habits in the area.

Six areas to be selected from the following Lists:

List A: British Isles (two contrasting areas to be selected):

Mountain Regions (Scottish Highlands, Snowdonia, Peak District etc.); Coastal Regions and Inland Waters (Fylde, Isle of Wight, Norfolk Broads, etc.);

Cultural and Conference Regions (London, Shakespeare Country etc.).

List B: Europe and the Mediterranean (three items to be selected):

Iberian Peninsula and Balearic Isles;

Alpine Europe;

Scandinavia;

The Mediterranean Riviera of France and Italy;

The Islands of the Mediterranean;

Eastern Europe and Black Sea resorts;
Adriatic Coastal areas;
Countries of North West Europe;
The Aegean area;
Israel, Egypt and Turkey.

List C: Overseas (one item to be selected):

Western Canada and the Western U.S.A.;

Eastern Canada (i.e. east of the Great Lakes);

Florida and the Gulf Coast;

New York and the Eastern Seaboard;

The West Indies and Bermuda;

Australasia;

South and East Africa.
